We are now including the number of days passed since the last positive test of a Resident or staff member. These data are important waypoints as we look toward opening communal programs and group dining on different campuses. The phased opening will be more stringent in MA compared to the federal (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services -CMS) phasing guidelines. At this time, we do not have finalized guidelines from the Department of Public Health (DPH) on the phasing of Massachusetts nursing homes. We are currently using the CMS guidelines to guide the phased openings of our Independent and Assisted Living communities. This data is to give you a simple measure to gauge our progress toward opening. The current federal (CMS) regulation requires buildings to go 14 days without a new case among staff and residents. Each consecutive 14 day stretch will allow us to move to the next phase. Please watch for other communications from us regarding the phased opening of your community and service level in the coming days and weeks as we carefully progress through this process. We appreciate your patience as we work through this constantly evolving situation.
